IMMANUEL SPEAKS JULY 2024



Dearest Friends in Christ,

In a few days we will celebrate the 248th anniversary of our country's independence. Now as we celebrate this event I would like to ask you a question. Who is the freest person in the world? Now I think many of us would say it would be us, the American citizen. We have so many freedoms; we can do just about anything within reason. As Americans we have: freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom of the press, freedom to bear arms, freedom to assemble, the right to equal justice, the right to own private property and the list goes on and on.

However, I believe the answer isn't Americans. Rather the answer is Christians. Now, some people might say that Christians are not free, that we have to live by a certain set of laws and do the right things to please God or to get to heaven. However, that is not the case. We do not have to do anything for our salvation, there are no points to earn or score sheet in heaven to see if we have done enough. In fact, when it comes to our salvation we find that we are powerless. The apostle Paul in Romans chapter three tells us that we cannot earn our way into heaven, that "All have sinned fallen short of the glory of God." Later in Romans chapter six Paul would put it this way, "The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life." There is nothing we can do for our salvation because we are sinners. However, the good news is that God in divine mercy has given us freedom! God has redeemed us and set us free.

Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through his life, death, and resurrection has given us freedom from sin, death, the devil, and those forces that seek to keep us from God so that we might have live with him both now and forever. Because of his work and love shown through his life, crucifixion, and resurrection we are free; free from sin, death, and the devil and will live eternally.

Luther would put it this way in his explanation to the 2nd article of the creed; "We believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and delivered me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death, in order that I may be wholly His own, and live under him in His kingdom, and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, even as He is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true." There is nothing we can do or that we have to do. Dead in sin, through Christ we have freedom! Dead in sin, through Christ we know live as God's chosen and beloved!

And just as we have our freedoms in this country such as the right to bear arms, free speech and many others, we as Christians have been freed by God to be his own and to be who we are created to be. We remember God's original command to Adam and Eve as he called them to be fruitful and multiply, and to be stewards, partners with God in caring for all of creation. We are freed from all that separates us from relationship with God, and we are freed to care for God's creation and the world around us.

Martin Luther would write in *The Freedom of a Christian*, "We are perfectly free lords of all subject to none, and yet at the same time dutiful servants of all, subject to all." This is the freedom God has given us as he has rescued us from sin; called and claimed us as his own for all eternity. This is the freedom that God has given us as he sends us as his beloved people into the world so that others might know the love of God. We are freed from all that separates us from relationship with God, and we are freed to join in God's mission for all of his creation!

My friends as we celebrate our Independence Day, and give God thanks for all of the wonderful liberties that we have; let us also take time daily to give him thanks for the greatest Independence Day that happened two thousand plus years ago in the life, death, and resurrection of our savior who has freed us from all that separates us from life with him. Let us give thanks that God has freed us to be who we are called to be; disciples sharing his love and caring for his creation.


OPEN RADIO BROADCASTS FOR 2024

Immanuel is signed up as a participant of the NexTrex Challenge! What is it, you ask? If we can save 1000 pounds of plastic before May, 2025, Trex will give us a bench for our courtyard made from this plastic. Trex is a composite material most often used for decking, etc. A list of specifics is in the back of church, but mostly it is plastic with a little stretch; which includes store grocery bags, wrapping of beverage bottles, toilet paper wrapping, bread bags, softener salt bags, film wrap from shipping products, etc. It takes a lot of this plastic to equal a pound, but it can be done. Two large white boxes are located in church for placement of your donations. One is in the library, off of the sanctuary, and the other is in the lower level of the parish hall, right below the steps. Plastic will be collected, weighed and reported to the Trex company and dropped at one of their many locations in Willmar. Hope you will all participate!!
